

Course discipline/number/title: PNM 1320: Family and Mental Health Concepts

A. CATALOG DESCRIPTION

- 1. Credits: 6
- 2. Hours/Week: 4 hours lecture per week for 16 weeks. 10 hours lab/clinical per week for 8 weeks. Course is 16 weeks.
- 3. Prerequisites (Course discipline/number): PNM 1200, PNM 1210, PNM 1250
- 4. Other requirements: Satisfactory completion of Semester I requirements in the PN program sequence must be met before enrolling.

- B. COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course introduces concepts related to mental health, obstetric, and pediatric nursing. Basic principles of mental health well-being and common mental health disorders is introduced. This course also introduces concepts related to contraception, conception, antenatal, labor and delivery and postpartum nursing care as well as common complications. The pediatrics portion includes concepts related to theories of growth and development, congenital disorders, and common pediatric health disorders. Special topics include therapeutic communication, cultural diversity and utilizing standardized evidence-based assessment tools with adults and children in clinical and lab/simulation settings. Clinical experiences occur in in-patient and a variety of out-patient/community settings.

 - 7. Psychosocial concepts affecting the infant and child
